Understanding the Survey Tables

Each page of the survey tables contains a cross-tabulation of one or more questions asked in the survey. One question is plotted horizontally and another is plotted vertically. The first section of information at the top of each page summarizes totals for the horizontal variable (in this case, the undergraduate class year). There were 24 total respondents with an undergraduate class year before 1950, 52 from 1950-59, etc.

The tables provide four lines of information about each combination of question responses: The *number*, the *row percentage* (Row %), the *column percentage* (Col %) and the *total percentage* (Tot %).

Number tells us: 12 respondents had a class year before 1950 and "strongly agreed" that they had a satisfying student experience.

The *row percentage* (Row %) tells us: 1.3% of everyone who "strongly agreed" that they had a satisfying student experience was in a class year before 1950.
